FOREWARD.

"The growing belief that the schools must deal with every day living is the greatest forward movement in education,"—education meaning a training which fits for all the duties of Life. It means a development of mind and muscle, a training for citizenship, for home-making, for parenthood, and for social and economic duties.

This education is derived largely from the surroundings and experiences of the individual, and not from the mere acquiring of information thru the medium of the printed page.

More than two-fifths of the pupils who enter the public schools drop out before reaching Grade VI. Why? Chiefly because they see little or no connection between the teaching in the school and their everyday life.

Thru gardening, stock-raising, sewing, cooking, etc., the child is brought into contact with the real things of life. We believe, however, that gardening takes precedence over other activities in cultural value. The training received developes Head and Heart as well as Hand. Geography, Drawing, Arithmetic, Chemistry, Physics and English composition are all vitalized by being related to Gardening - to operations easily understood by the child, because seen and experienced.

Respect for the rights of others; appreciation of the dignity of common tasks; an intimate relationship with the wonderworking forces of the universe; responsiveness to the charm of the beautiful out-of-doors; all these become the possession of the human being who is a co-worker with nature and with nature's God.

GENERAL REGULATIONS.

- 1 The Fair to be held in the Scout Building at Hantsport, on Friday, Sept 26th, 1919.
- 2. Building to be open on Thursday, 25th, at 10 a. m for reception and arrangement of exhibits. All exhibits must be in place by 10 a m. the day of the Fair. Positively no exhibit will be received after that hour.
- 3. Articles must be the growth, product or manufacture of the present year
- 4. Premiums to be awarded to competitors for articles of their own growth and production.
- 5. Every article, whatsoever, must have the name of the article attached with the number, grade and age, but not the name of the exhibitor.
- 6. No person will be allowed to enter, for exhibition, more than one specimen in any one section of a class. This rule applies strictly to all exhibits.
- 7. Building open only to committees, exhibitors, and persons employed, until 10 a m. the day of the Fair, after which the public will be admitted. General admission, Adults, 20c.; children under fourteen, 5c
- 8. Compliance with conditions will be required without exception
- 9 No person shall be allowed to receive more than one prize in any one section of a class.
